NSF to establish the Research Experience for Teachers: IDEA-BioE

KU has secured a three-year, \$586,645 grant from the National Science Foundation to establish the Research Experience for Teachers: IDEA-BioE.

The project will pair six middle school math and science teachers from the Topeka Public Schools and six pre-service science teachers from KU's STEMTeach program with researchers in the School of Engineering.

Introducing COGEiS: The Center for Net Carbon Zero GeoEnergy Intelligence and Sustainability

The Chemical & Petroleum Engineering Department is excited to announce a new research center C0GEiS: The Center for Net Carbon Zero GeoEnergy Intelligence and Sustainability. This new center stems from a collaboration between CPE faculty members Amirmasoud (Masoud) Kalantari (top, left), Shahin Negahban (right, center), Mark Shiflett (left, bottom), their respective research groups, and their external collaborators at UCLA and the Illinois State Geological Survey. Through this new center, Dr. Kalantari is the Principal Investigator and leading a \$3.49 million project funded by The US Department of Energy (DOE) to develop a novel "Smart Microchip Proppants" technology for precision diagnostics of hydraulic fracture networks (project duration 2019- 2023).

NSF EPSCOR Grant Will Advance Manufacturing Of Renewable And Recyclable Plastics



Plastics are an indispensable part of today's society. These nimble polymers help keep foods fresh, cars safe, arteries clog-free and have countless other uses. But the benefits come at a cost. Each year millions of tons of discarded plastic pollute ecosystems, harm animals and exacerbate climate change.

Now, a \$4 million award from the National Science Foundation's EPSCoR RII Track 2 program will bring together researchers from Kansas and Delaware and fund work to improve how plastics are manufactured and recycled.



Subramaniam is one of five professors who will lead and supervise specific parts of the research. Others include Alan Allgeier, associate professor of chemical & petroleum engineering and CEBC deputy director; Donna Ginther, Roy A. Roberts Distinguished Professor of Economics and director of KU's Institute for Policy & Social Research; Timothy Dawsey, executive director of the Kansas Polymer Research Center at Pittsburg State University; and Raul Lobo, Claire D. LeClaire Professor of Chemical & Biomolecular Engineering at the University of Delaware.
